



Welcome aboard Motor Yacht Brava, it is our absolute pleasure to host you. To ensure we can provide you with the best experience, it is important we outlay the following safety guidelines.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to ask a Crew Member for assistance at any time.

Medical conditions & Allergies

If you have any pre- existing medical conditions or allergies, please make this known to a crew member before your trip on Brava begins. This will ensure we are prepared to assist you as best as possible if required.

Crew Members

- **Captain | Alex Malone:** Captain Alex is responsible for the operation of the vessel and is the maximum authority on board the vessel and its crew.
- **Chef | Jorge Bernal:** Chef Jorge will prepare all the delicious meals served on Brava. If you have any specific food allergies, preferences, or dislikes, feel free to let the Chef know and he will do his best to accommodate your needs.
- **Stewardess | Ruby Solomon:** Ruby is responsible for all customer service needs, including drink service, food service, special requests and the cleaning and upkeep of the interior of the vessel.
- **Senior Deckhand |** Is responsible for the Cleaning and upkeep of the exterior of the vessel. He will assist you with all water activities and toys and ensure you feel confident and safe before entering the water.
- **Junior Deckhand | Jesus:** Jesus is responsible for the Cleaning and upkeep of the exterior of the vessel. He will assist you with all water

activities and toys and ensure you feel confident and safe before entering the water.

Security on board the vessel

- The vessel has the following emergency equipment.
 - Life jackets in every guest cabin inside the closet.
 - Two emergency rafts on the Fly Deck.
 - Satellite location equipment.
 - First Aid Kit.
- All emergency situations will be led by the captain and all guests must follow instruction from the crew.
- During docking and anchoring all passengers must collaborate with the crew by;
 - Keeping the volume of the music down
 - Limiting their movement around the vessel and staying clear of the Aft deck when docking.
 - Please watch any young children so the crew can communicate efficiently.
- When the vessel is underway, guests must follow these recommendations.
 - Walk slowly around the boat using handrails and handles. A great rule to remember is **ONE HAND FOR YOU, ONE HAND THE BOAT.**
 - Try not to leave objects like glasses and cups around the boat or in cabins. Please give to the stewardess.
 - Be careful with children walking around the sides of the boat, they should always accompanied by an adult.
 - If the passenger is inside of its room, make sure not to open any windows.
 - Close all doors and/or cabinets open.
 - Do not throw anything into the water

- When the vessel is at anchor or docked, the passengers should be aware of the following recommendations.
 - Never get in the water until the captain authorizes to do so.
 - Do not run around the boat, especially up and down the stairs.
 - Do not throw anything to the water.
- The crew can perform First Aid in case of emergency.
- All guests are asked to stay away from any operation of the boat's engines, steering wheel, platform, etc.
- If you notice anything that seems unusual, e.g.; A strange noise, water leaking, strange objects in the water, please notify the crew immediately.

Services on board

Audio and video

- The vessel has a multi-zone audio system which allows guests to play their music from most devices. Please ask the crew how to use the system.
- There is a BRAVA I-pad with Spotify music for guests use.
- The vessel has flat screen TVs where guests can play movies and SKY Mexico TV.
- Guests are asked not to take the TV remotes out of their cabins since they are specific to each TV.

Food and drinks

- The crew is responsible for food and drink service onboard.
- Guests are asked not to leave any glasses unattended since they could fall and/or break.
- Guests are asked not to eat any snacks that could easily stain decks and fabrics such as chocolate and chips.
- Do not eat inside of the cabins.
- The chef will prepare all main meals (Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner depending on the length of your trip). If you are hungry between meals, please ask the stewardess for further assistance.

Smoking

- Guests are asked not to smoke in the interior of the vessel and to be careful when smoking outside considering ashes can burn through the covers and cushions.
- If you wish to smoke, please ask the crew for Ash trays.
- Please try to smoke towards the back of the vessel and away from the wind.

Water activities

Use of the tender

- The tender can only be operated by the crew or unless authorized by the captain.
- **Jet skis**
Please follow the safety directions from the crew before use.
- **Sea bobs**
Please follow the safety directions from the crew before use.
- **Paddle Boards**
Please follow the safety directions from the crew before use.
- **Kayaks**
Please follow the safety directions from the crew before use.

Outside showers (Located at the bottom of each staircase of the Swim Platform)

- Please make use of the showers after swimming in salt water and use a towel before coming up to the main deck.
- Please wash away any sand from your body before coming up to the main deck.
- Guests are asked not to go inside the vessel wearing wet clothes and to please not sit on cushions or chairs.

Towels and sunscreens

- Beach towels are kept outside the Saloon doors. Please do not bring towels from the cabins outside. The crew will make these easily accessible for all guests.
- There is a box of sunscreens, lotions, and bug repellents available for guests on the Starboard side bench on the Aft deck. If you prefer to use your own sun products, please use cream-based lotions or sprays, try to avoid oil-based, as they can stain towels, cushions, and the teak deck.
- There is a box of Brava Sun hats and T-shirts available for guest use located next to the Sunblock Box on the Starboard side bench of the Aft deck.

Swimming and Sporting Goods

- There is a diverse selection of sporting and swimming goods onboard the vessel which can be provided by the crew.
- Guests are responsible to know how to operate the equipment before using it.
- Guests are asked not to swim too far from the vessel, especially when there are other boats around as well as not swimming too close to the stabilizers (located on the back sides of the boat) since these can be harmful.

Bathrooms and Cabins

Showers

- Guests are recommended to use the shower mats provided to prevent falls and injury.
- Guests are asked to leave their swimsuits hanging in the shower to dry or ask the stewardess if you would like to hang them in the engine room.

Toilets

- Please try to use the minimum amount of toilet paper
- The **only thing** that can be **flushed down the toilet is a small amount of toilet paper**. Nothing else can be flushed including tampons, wet wipes or tissues. Please dispose of these things in the rubbish bin.
- To use the toilets, please press the button on the left-hand side first, to allow water into the toilet and then press the button on the right-hand side to flush. If you have any further questions, you can ask the Stewardess.

Lights and Blinds

- Please turn off all light in the cabins when not in use.
- The blinds on the cabins can be opened and closed. Guests are asked to operate them carefully.

Clothes and Luggage

Shoes

- Guests are asked to please not wear shoes on board the vessel.
- There is grey shoe box located on the Aft Deck for guest's shoes.

Luggage

- The deckhands will assist you with carrying any luggage onboard.
- When unpacking, guests are asked to please not to place their luggage on top of the beds to avoid staining the sheets.
- Once unpacked, please leave your empty luggage in your room and the stewardess will take it to storage to allow more space in your cabins.
- Please use the closet and drawers to store your clothes and personal items.
- Please lock doors and drawers to make sure they do not open when the vessel is underway.
- Once unpacked, please leave your empty luggage in your room and the stewardess will move it to storage to allow more space in your cabins.

Laundry

- The vessel has washer and dryer on board.
- Guest laundry is done by the stewardess every second day. Please leave laundry in the Cotton Laundry bags provided (these are in the bottom drawer in the bathrooms) and leave at the bottom of your bed **before 11am**. Laundry will be returned to you the same evening.
- Please make the stewardess aware of any specific washing directions if needed.
- If you would prefer to wash your own laundry, please ask the Stewardess to show you how to operate the machines.
- The engine room (when the vessel is not moving) is a great place to dry off swimwear, towels, or clothes quickly and safely. Please ask the Stewardess for assistance with this.
